



RECIPE Cottage/Shepherds Pie

Ingredients

450g lean minced beef/lamb
1 onion, chopped.
2 carrots, peeled and diced.
2 tbsp porage oats
1 tbsp tomato sauce.
1 tbsp Worcestershire sauce
450ml stock
675g potatoes, peeled and cut into chunks.
2 parsnips, peeled and cut into chunks
Knob of butter
Salt and pepper

Method

- In a large pan, bring potatoes and parsnips to the boil, lower heat and cook for 20 minutes until soft. Once cooked, drain and mash with butter and seasoning.
- 2. In a non-stick pan, dry fry the meat with the onions and carrots until the mince is brown and well cooked.
- 3. Stir in the porage oats, tomato sauce and Worcestershire sauce, and cook for one minute, stirring all the time.
- add the stock, bring to the boil and cook for 10 minutes until the carrots are just soft.
- 5. Transfer the mixture to an ovenproof dish, and spoon the mash over the top.
- Cook in a pre-heated oven for 30 minutes at 200C/400F/Gas mark 6.

Serve with peas or baked beans.
