#### LOCAL HISTORY GROUP

At the last meeting, Dr. Margaret Bonney gave a fascinating talk about "Prisoners of War in Leicestershire: 1943-48", a full account of which is displayed on the Local History Notice Board in the Library.

After the interval, Francis and Arnold Geary described scenes from their boyhood when they saw POWs working in Ratby. They recalled how the Italians had a liking for sardines dipped in jam! On one occasion they saw a rather portly sentry hand his rifle to one of the prisoners while he struggled to get over a barbwire fence!!

Many Ratby people developed strong friendships with the POWs, tinged with guilt because their relatives were still fighting on the continent. These relationships sometimes led to marriage.

One group of POWs presented their foreman, Edgar Powell of Ratby, with a booklet of cartoons, including photographs and autographs.





### **VALLEY BAKERY**

Following our feature in the last issue we have had some stories of employment at Geary's Bakery.

#### A different kind of 'flour' power in the 60s!

Jim Briggs recollections were of the arduous task of delivering flour to the bakery in the early sixties. He worked for F R Thompson, and tells us that the Ratby Bakery was regarded by all the company drivers as the 'worst place to drop off a delivery in the County.'

A hundred bags of flour, each weighing ten stone had to be carried on your back up wooden steps that were practically vertical. The flour had to be taken up to the first floor from where it was tipped down a chute into the mixing room below.

He says, 'You suffered with your back when you started, but you got used to it.'

Anthony Tate worked for Geary's in the 1960s, maintaining the vehicles and machinery. Later he drove a local delivery round to shops and businesses. He recalls that there were around 6 or 8 delivery vans at the time.

#### Of loaves and efficiency!

Hoz Gamble was employed post-retirement in 1987 as a part time telephone sales clerk. At the time the bakery dealt with over 800 customers, ranging from large organisations or companies to small shops and cafes, all supplied by a fleet of thirty delivery vans.

Hoz' role was to manage the orders of customers who did not have standing orders. The requirements had to be noted on specially printed sheets. Each of the two hundred items of bread or cakes had their own reference number. The orders were collated so that they could be presented to the bakery at 5 pm sharp for an immediate start on production.

Demand varied from time to time, and Hoz had to stay until all customers had been contacted. Orders for hot cross buns and mince pies meant busy times in the office and bakery!

Celebration cakes were dealt with separately in

decoration and wording could be recorded precisely. There were two very skilled employees engaged in producing the most beautiful creations to satisfy customer's expectations.

At the end of my Hoz' five years with the company computers had begun to take on much of the work, and he was retained as a receptionist until fully retiring at the age of seventy.

He says, 'These days are remembered fondly because I had a very cordial relationship with management and staff, both in the office and bakery, and it was there that the nickname Hoz was bestowed on me! Along with many Ratby folk I miss so much that gorgeous aroma of baking bread which regularly emanated from the Valley Bakery and permeated the whole village.

#### Message in the fridge could save your life.


There is a scheme to help save lives by people leaving a message for the emergency services in their fridge.

Sponsored by the Lions charity, *Message in a Bottle* is a way of getting vital information across quickly and simply in an emergency. The bottles will be available free of charge from Ratby Neighbourhood Watch at various events during 2011 – if you can't attend an event please register your interest with the Watch (saltbox39@keme.co.uk) or with our beat officers PC 334 Justin Hayes and PCSO 6552 Mo Musa.

The scheme uses a distinctive green and white plastic bottle in which you can place anything which may useful to the emergency services. The bottle comes with a form on which you can give personal details, including what medication you are using and an emergency contact. The bottle is placed inside your fridge and one green sticker is put on the outside of the fridge and another inside the front door. If you then become ill, any paramedics called would see the stickers and be able to find the bottle in the fridge. Thanks to the information in the container, they could treat you appropriately, and let your emergency contact know what has happened. The police and fire brigade also recognise the stickers and know what to do. When RNHW receives its supply of the bottles they will go first to neighbourhood watch members and then out to the wider community. Once again my thanks to whoever supplied these words which I have changed to suit our purposes! CM
