CHEESE OMELETTE for ONE

Ingredients:

- 2 eggs per person
- 1 teaspoon cold water per egg
- A little grated cheese to taste
- Knob of butter
- Salt and pepper.

Method:

- 1 Melt the butter over a medium heat in an omelette pan or small frying pan with a thick base.
- 2 While the butter is melting break the eggs into a bowl and beat together with the water. Season if liked.
- 3 Pour the mixture into the butter in the omelette pan.
- 4 Stir with a fork until no liquid egg remains, and when set sprinkle the surface with the cheese.
- 5 Fold the omelette over, using a broad server and place on a heated plate.
- 6 Eat at once with salad, peas or baked beans.

Alternative fillings include cooked mushrooms or diced cooked chicken, instead of or with the cheese.



A COMMUNITY ORCHARD APPLE

BROWNLEES RUSSET

Brownlees' Russet was a popular russet apple in the Victorian era but unlike some of its contemporaries (notably Egremont Russet) it is rarely seen. It was rated by the Victorian writer Hogg as an excellent late apple, suitable for dessert and cooking.

Brownlees' Russet is noticeably different from the mainstream russet varieties. There is clearly something a bit stronger in its make-up it recalls another, older, russet variety, Ashmeads Kernel in this respect. The flavour is more robust with pear-drop overtones, and it is a far better keeper than many other russets, indeed it is probably at its best when stored for 2-3 months. However it shares some of the other typical characteristics of russet apples - it is easy to grow and has good disease resistance, and attractive blossom.

Leicester is a very active pétanque county with some 28 clubs supporting 48 teams playing in five divisions.






Wot! Delivery Stalwart Retires
