


Four deep raised beds 8' x 3' x 27" high have been constructed at the Taverner Drive site. and will be filled with soil.

The Quiz sheets also proved popular, and raised £80 for the Orchard. Congratulations to Karen and Alan Roberts of Station Road who won the prize of £25.



Don't forget the date **Wednesday 17th December at 6.30pm.** Let's keep this tradition alive and make a joyful noise in the heart of our village.





BURROUGHS SOUP

Ingredients (serves 6)

50 g (2 oz) butter

3 medium onions, peeled and chopped 1 kg (2lbs) potatoes, peeled and diced 1 kg (2lbs) leeks, sliced 600 ml (1pt) chicken stock Salt and black pepper

To add when reheated for eating; 300 ml (1/2 pint) chicken stock 600 ml (1pt) creamy milk.

Method

- 1. Melt the butter in a saucepan, add onions, potatoes and leeks and fry gently for 5 minutes.
- 2. Stir in 600 ml of stock and seasoning and bring to the boil.
- 3. Cover and simmer for 40 minutes or until vegetables are tender.
- 4. Whisk or puree in a blender.
- 5. At this stage you can either cool and freeze, or add the extra stock and milk, reheat and serve straight away.


