
> **PARENTS! Swimming For All** 1st Ratby Scout Group



By now, many of you will be aware that Ratby village is being policed by not one but two police officers who have been patrolling Ratby since December '97. Your new beat officers are PC 4075 Julia SHOWELL and PC 1063 Rob SHOWELL

Rob and Julia are a husband and wife Team with the prime responsibility of policing Ratby village but they also have the task of helping PC 4217 Hazel FOSSEY who is the beat officer for the neighbouring village of Groby. This should prove to be a significant advantage as Ratby and Groby 'share' many things including some of their problems.

Both Rob and Julia are keen to be integrated into the village and want to be seen to provide a high profile and high quality service to the residents of Ratby. One of their first steps is to relaunch Ratby Neighbourhood Watch which appears to have dwindled recently.

Neighbourhood Watch has many benefits and is based on the 'good neighbour' concept and encourages householders to:-

1) Take an interest in the security of each others property and through natural observation, report suspicious or unusual activity to the police.

2) Mark their valuable property and personal possessions with their post code, as a deterrent to the would-be thief and to aid recovery, should any item be lost or stolen.

3) Improve the security of their own homes and Your message will then be confidentially stored for vehicles through an awareness of simple and basic the officer's attention. security measures made available in consultation with NOTE: In case of difficulty, wait for further Scheme Co-ordinators and the police. instructions.

4) Share and communicate information which would assist them in achieving (1) to (4) above.

If you are interested in starting a Neighbourhood Watch Scheme in your area then please do not hesitate in contacting either Rob or Julia. Details of how to do this are at the end of this article.

Listen to the officer's personal greeting then record your message after the tone.

Quiche Lorraine

Ingredients



#### Short Crust Pastry

4 oz (100gr) Plain flour  $2\frac{1}{2}$  oz (60gr) Fat - mixture of lard and firm margarine Pinch of salt Water or egg to mix

#### Filling

2 oz (50gr) Bacon Chopped 1½ oz (30gr) Onion or spring onion chopped ½ oz (15gr) Butter or oil 1½- 2 oz (30-50gr) Tasty cheese Salt and Pepper to taste 1 Large egg or 2 yolks 1/4 Pint (150ml) Milk or single cream

#### Method

- Make pastry, roll into a circle and line greased 6 or 7 inch flan ring or sandwich tin pressing gently to exclude air bubbles. Leave to rest for 10 minutes.
- 2. Put baking tray in centre of oven to heat, before placing quiche in oven.
- 3. Fry onions and bacon in butter slowly until just turning colour.
- 4. Beat egg in a jug and add cheese, salt, pepper and milk.
- 5. Add onions and bacon.
- 6. Pour into pastry case.
- Bake for 10 minutes at gas mark 6, 400 °F, 200 °C then reduce to gas mark 4, 350°F, 180°C, for a further 20 - 30 minutes until golden brown and firm to touch (cover with foil if browning too much).
- Note: This quantity can be used to make 12 small quiche. Reduce 2nd cooking time to 15 - 20 minutes.
