

IDA MARY BARNETT (nee CRAGG) HER MEMORIES of RATBY

My Grandmother Ida Mary Barnett (nee Cragg) was born in 1890 daughter of William Taylor Cragg and Eva Constance Cragg. She married my Grandfather Robert Barnett in 1914 and lived all of her married life in Laburnum Cottages 3, Station Road Ratby. The house numbering system changed in the 1960's and the house now is number 189, Station Road. She died in 1963 and notes were found in her Bible after her death. I believe these were written a little over 100 years ago.

A transcript of the notes:

I can remember from my early days of 6 year old

I can remember two large bells being put in Ratby church

I also remember the Bor (Boer) war and two Ratby men that fought in that war, also the opening of the men's adult school and the hymn they sang at the opening, What a friend we have in Jesus.

I remember the first wireless being used in the midlands, at one time I remember dancing being held in Edmond Richards field below the station which was conducted by the Ratby string band.

I was born in Yew Trees yard, the oldest house I can remember was called Bumble Bee Hall,

I remember Queen Victoria's jubilee, also Sammy Holt the town cry and second hand

George Parker was killed in Ratby quarry, at his funeral service they sang, Praise to the Holiest in the Highest, also trams were drawn by horses in the city of Leicester,

There was what was called a Penfold in the centre of Ratby village,

Behind the Plow Inn was once a little village called Ratae also an old Roman encampment near Holywell farm.

There is the woods called Burrows which is supposed to be a burying ground of the Romans.

Some years ago living at the old Hays Farm was a gentleman, when he died he left a will to the widows and widowers of Ratby village, you will find his monument in Ratby church chancel.

I remember old Bessy Ball living in a little cottage opposite Box Tree farm in the centre of the village, pig killing was a usual thing, in open back yards in bygone days, washing pots were used in those days instead of coppers

When I was young I joined the Band of Hope Temperance Society, which we had what was called an annual outing to Bradgate Park, drove by horses and carts, I also took my concertina which I played before the audience in the ruins of Bradgate Park,

I also remember the hymn they sang at the opening of Ratby Chapel on Gordons Bank and so on. John Neal was the first to be married in that Chapel.

RECIPE

CHOCOLATE TRUFFLES

Ingredients

50g 92 oz) butter 2 tablespoons icing sugar 5/6 trifle sponge cakes 75g (3 oz) plain chocolate bar 1 tablespoon of rum for flavour if desired. To coat, choose from: chocolate vermicelli, coarsely grated chocolate, or crumbled chocolate flake.

- 1. Cream butter and icing sugar until light and fluffy.
- 2. Crumble trifle sponges and beat into butter mixture
- 3. Melt broken-up chocolate in a Pyrex bowl over a saucepan of hot water or in the microwave for 10 seconds at a time, beating in between.
- 4. Swirl cake mix into the chocolate, blending well. Add rum at this stage.
- 5. Form mixture into small balls, toss in chosen coating, and place in paper cases.


When walking around the village some, (like one in Main Street shown in the photograph), are more easy to spot than others!



Polls suggested that 22% of students would not vote on May 6th. I strongly believe that this is not because they are uninterested, or because they don't believe their vote will count. but because there is a lack of political education in schools, which has left this generation of first time voters without the necessary knowledge of political parties. candidates, and the voting system. In the school curriculum for students in year 7year 11, PHSE and Citizenship are mandatory subjects in which students learn about personal, health and social issues that will affect them in the future. Main topics included sex education, drug and drink awareness. smoking, healthy eating and physical hygiene. The lessons were repetitive, dry, and often presented pupils with information we were already aware of.

Throughout my experience in these subjects which are intended to increase awareness of the outside world. I only ever recall one occasion where we studied politics. I have had a strong interest in politics from around age 15. and felt perhaps that lessons would become more interesting for me and other pupils if we could study a subject a number of us felt passionate about. The lessons became more tedious than ever. On more than one occasion the class watched the same video describing the 'first past the post system.' My enthusiasm was henceforth diminished, and many of my peers decided politics was boring and a waste of time.
