
# **RATBY PARISH CHURCH NEWS**

St. Philip's and St. James Church

Evening services restart from October on the first and third Sunday of the month, beginning at 6.00pm. All are welcome. On the first Sunday of each month there will be a communion service beginning at 6.00pm.

On the third Sunday there will be a service of evening prayer which will focus each month on one of three themes; Peace in our world, Reconciliation amongst people and Prayers for healing and wholeness. This will begin at 6.00pm and will use traditional and modern forms of prayer.

The service on 17th October will be a special memorial service for those who have lost loved ones, to which recently bereaved people will be invited. This will begin at 3.00pm and is open to all.



## **AUCTION IN AID OF CHURCH ROOF APPEAL**



He spoke of the cost to individual drug users, and how this could result in crimes such as burglary and car crime. A video highlighted the points he had made.

#### **Parish Council Office**

Work is currently under way at 13 Station Road in converting it into an office for the Parish Council. Some major structural repairs are required on this 19th Century building and considerable internal alterations are also required to bring it up to the required standard of a modern office. It is anticipated that the office will be ready for occupation in early 2000.

#### Commemorative Feature - Ex-railway line

A special feature, commemorating the Leicester/Swannington Railway line has been approved by Leicestershire County Council who now own the Right of Way from Ratby to Glenfield which was once part of the railway line. A drawing of the proposed feature which will mark the entrance to the Right of Way at Station Road, Ratby has been approved by the Parish Council and by Horace Gamble who gave a lot of his time to the project. Finding suitable sections of rail which may be used in the display is the next goal and of course finding sources of funding for the project which will be completed next year.

#### Thanks for Service

Steve Boud of 3 Ingle Drive has served as Parish Councillor since May 1996. As Chairman of the Leisure and Recreation Committee (since August 1996) Steve has worked tirelessly for the good of the village: a seven year lease on Burroughs Road Rec; new play equipment on Burroughs Road; a three-year grounds maintenance contract; a Community orchard and village pond are just some of the benefits that Ratby enjoys as a result of the enthusiasm and commitment of Steve and other members of the Leisure & Recreation Committee. Regrettably Steve has now resigned from the Council. We thank him for his work and commitment and wish him every success in his future career.







### **EXPLORING IN COUNTY AND CITY**



July is the month when there is no regular scheduled meeting, but instead an outdoor Sunday event usually attracts enough support to warrant the arrangements.

Staunton Harold, near Melbourne, was the venue for this year's outing, enjoyed by eighteen members. It was good to welcome our two out-of-towners from Oakham again.

Staunton Harold Hall dates from the 15th Century, but only part of the original remains. The present building is mainly of 18th Century construction. During the last war it was requisitioned by the Army, and then purchased by Group Captain Leonard Cheshire for use as a nursing home. The former library houses a popular cafe and charity shop.

The beautiful Gothic style church nearby is unusual in that it was built in 1653 by Sir Robert Shirley, baronet, when Cromwell's troops were busy desecrating as many churches as possible. Shirley's defiance led him to be beheaded in the Tower of London at the age of 27. There are other attractions to while away a pleasant summer afternoon, in the shape of a large garden centre with its own cafe, and yet another cafe in the former stable block which also houses art and craft shops.

#### **Medieval Leicester**

Another outdoor event took place in August when members were treated to an instructive, entertaining evening led by Lynn Mellor, on a town trail around Medieval Leicester. Commencing at Wygeston's House in Applegate, built in 1500 for a rich wool merchant, and now a costume museum, we moved on to the site of the High Cross, now marked by cruciform stones set in the roadway, which was the place of the Friday market. Nearby the 12th Century St. Nicholas Church, next to the Jewry Wall contains some earlier Saxon work. Bore interesting than that are the Roman made bricks incorporated in the tower. On then to Castle Park with its splendid Castle House built in 1446, adjoining St. Mary de Castro, parts of which date from 1107. Here the five year old Henry V1 was knighted. The Norman hall of the castle is unfortunately hidden by the 17th century brick facade and thus does not qualify for Medieval status.

In the Newarke (the New Work) sits the delightful Chantry House built in 1511 for the priests of a different St. Mary's, now marked by a plaque near the Technical school opposite. The eastern wall of the town, where W.H. Smith and Walkers are situated was also the boundary of the Saturday Market known to have existed before 1066, and still going strong! The jewel in the crown is The Guildhall, built in 1347, and extended in 1450 for the Guild of Corpus Christi. Although overshadowed by more well known places such as Lavenham and York, Leicester is not without its Middle Ages charm if one has as competent a guide as Lynn Mellor to unfold the history.

# RECIPE FARM HOUSE CIDER

## Ingredients

3 1b (1.350 kg ) Apples, any variety or mixture.

2 1b (907 gr) Granulated sugar


3 Lemons

12 pints of cold water

#### Method

- 1. Wash the apples, remove bruised parts, but use all the peel and core, then mince.
- 2. Pour into large container and pour water over.
- Leave for 1 week, stirring each morning and night.
- 4. Strain through muslin
- 5. Stir in peel and juice of lemons, and sugar, mix thoroughly.
- 6. Leave for 24 hours
- 7. Stir well, then strain into screw top GLASS bottles
- 8. Leave undisturbed in cool place for 2-3 weeks
- 9. Open carefully as it can be very fizzy.
- 10. Enjoy!
