

All at Sea

We were all at sea for the August meeting when Mr John Hayman gave a fascinating insight into how his model ships end up in bottles. Not only in bottles, but also in light bulbs and car headlamp bulbs!

Mr Hayman prepares his own scale drawings before making and painting a specific model ship, so that it perfectly portrays the original. To make a four-masted clipper with its many sails and rigging is a painstaking work of art, but to display it in a bottle seems nothing short of genius.

Malta and Gozo

'Still surrounded by Sea' was the subject of Hoz Gamble's talk in September, which featured these two small islands in the Mediterranean. 'You either love it or hate it' is often said of Malta, a rocky fortress island that has never completely recovered from intensive bombing in the Second World War. The island's history goes back 5000 years, it's history marked by ruined temples and over 300 beautiful churches left by the Knights of St John during their tenancy between 1530 and 1798. From 1800 the island was a prized British possession until becoming a republic in 1974.

UPDATES AND SNIPPETS

POLICING THE VILLAGE



Following the departure of PC "Reg" Varney it has now been confirmed that our new police officer is *PC Matt Bishop*. *PC Mahal* has also been allocated to the village

and the intention is that Ratby has dedicated police cover at all times.

Please note, there is virtually always an opportunity to ask questions of the police at council meetings.

TRAFFIC CALMING

Many people attended the public exhibition at the Methodist church. The display was then moved to the library, where it continued for several weeks in order to give everybody a chance to comment on the draft scheme for the village. The feedback includes both positive and negative comments and it is clear that the final scheme will look very different to the original draft. It is expected that the *revised scheme* will be presented to the council at the November meeting.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Despite objections, planning permission has been granted by Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council to build affordable housing in *Whittington Drive*.

The next step will be to try and ensure that local people who need affordable housing are given priority. The *Affordable Housing Survey* is now complete and just under a quarter of the forms

were returned, which is understood to be an average return rate. Of those who responded, over 68% voted in favour of a small development of affordable homes for local people and 65 responses indicated their need for affordable housing. The overall summary will be discussed at the October council meeting.

SCOOP THAT POOP!!

There is nothing worse than coming across dog poo that has been left behind by dog owners who cannot be bothered to clear up after their dog. Although this is breaking the law it is very hard to police. Shortage of dog-bins has been used as an excuse in the past, but that is now being rectified.

Four new dog bins have been purchased and will be situated at points in the village where we know there is a problem – at the top of Stamford

Street, behind the Orchard, near the new wood on Markfield Road and in the new open area on Taverner Drive (the "balance pond" field). This is only the start as the Leisure & Recreation team are reviewing the whole village with a view to supplying more waste and dog bins. The Eco-committee at the primary school has carried out its own survey as to where these should be placed but please let us have your views.



RECIPE SOLE BONNE FEMME

Ingredients

Sole fillets, 2 or 3 per person Lemon Juice, to own taste Salt and Pepper

 $\frac{1}{2}$ pint fish stock (or use stock cube)

2 Tablespoons white wine or cider

½ a finally chopped shallot or onion

1 oz/25 gr. Sliced mushrooms

1 oz/25 gr. Butter + extra for greasing

 $\frac{3}{4}$ oz/18 gr. Flour

1 Tablespoon cream

Method

- 1. Set oven to 190C/375F/Gas Mark 5
- Grease casserole with butter
- 3. Put onion and mushrooms into casserole.
- 4. Season sole fillets with salt, pepper and lemon juice
- 5. Fold fillets into three and place in casserole
- 6. Pour over hot stock to 2/3 depth and add
- 7. Cover casserole with lid or foil
- 8. Bake for 15-20 minutes
- 9. Carefully remove fillets and keep warm
- 10. Melt butter in a small saucepan, and gradually add flour to make smooth paste.
- 11. Add sufficient strained cooking liquid to make a smooth white sauce.
- 12. Taste and adjust seasoning.
- 13. Gradually beat in the cream and pour over the fillets
- 14. Garnish with the cooked onion and mushrooms, and freshly chopped parsley
