

### A FUTURE for RATBY LIBRARY



Ken Hunnybun, Co-ordinator for Volunteers, prepares to meet and greet attendees for the information meeting held in the library on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> March.

Graham Stanley, Chairman of the Library Group welcomed potential volunteers and outlined progress and plans for the soon- to-be Community Managed Library. He emphasised that library services would continue as now, with books provided through the County Council Service, and services such as reservations and home deliveries continuing. Only the loan of DVDs will be discontinued.

The Library Group is planning to make the Library more of a community venue, with improved Wi-Fi and computer access, a café serving drinks and biscuits, and improved facilities such as toilets and baby changing. And it's hoped that hours will be extended, with the library opening for six days a week and some evenings. The contract to be signed stipulates that the fifteen hours minimum currently provided must continue.

#### RATBY LIBRARY PLANS

Response to the questionnaires sent out revealed that the most popular services, in order, were; Computer Classes for 'Silver Surfers,' the Café, Children's activities, visits by agencies such as Age UK, Talks by local authors and sessions bringing young parents together.

All of this would depend on attracting sufficient voluntary help.

Ken Hunnybun outlined how the proposed system would work, with potential volunteers receiving training and support from team leaders whilst working in pairs to administer the library service and run the café. A rota would be drawn up in advance.

If you haven't yet thought about volunteering, why not give it a try? Volunteers gain skills and experience which are useful when job hunting, as well as a social life, and the opportunity to do something for the community!

#### **GET READY FOR RATBY'S FIRST YARD SALES!**

Organised by the Eco-Team at St Philip and St James Parish Church, Ratby will be holding its first (and hopefully annual) Yard Sales on Bank Holiday Monday 4<sup>th</sup> May 2015 starting at 10am until 3pm.

Residents of Ratby who wish to hold a Yard Sale on their property are invited to register their address, free of charge, on a live on-line map so that people know where the sales are taking place. In addition to registering the location of your sale it is suggested that you give a brief summary of what you will be selling, that way people can search out more easily what they want to find. On the day you simply set up and sell your belongings, somewhere on your property, on your drive, or in your garage. The live map can be accessed on the day using mobile phones etc. or printed maps detailing the location of the garage sales will be available in the Church. The event will be widely advertised to bring in outsiders and also encourage Ratby residents to make a tour of the village, meet their neighbours and buy someone else's unwanted treasures. You will find a few dos and don'ts and tips for sellers on the website.

On the day the Church will be open serving hot and cold drinks and homemade cakes between the hours of 10am and 3pm.

There is no charge to register your Yard Sale or any commission charge. The aim of the event is to recycle unwanted goods all for the greater good of our lovely planet.

Nathan says he felt it was an important project, particularly as it preserves village history, with snapshots of village life and photographs of historical importance.

At present previous issues can be read in Ratby Library, where Ratby History Group have placed specially bound and indexed copies of the earliest volumes in the reference section. Nathan says, 'I wanted to save all issues in a digital format that can be downloaded by anyone. It will be a 'page-turnable,' searchable archive.'

It will be useful to the producers of 'Wot' too, as we will be able to readily access and refer to articles that have featured in early issues. Nathan tells us that he talked to Wot's editor about the idea, and was astonished to discover that we do not produce the magazine electronically. Considerable time has been spent scanning every issue to date for the project.

After graduating from university in software engineering Nathan worked on website development and then set up his own business. We'll be featuring this in our next issue. Nathan has supported 'Wot' through his advertisement for the company 'Ipaqrepair' for some years now. Find it on the back page!
