CHURCHYARD WILDLIFE

Ratby's Church Eco enthusiasts met with David Nicholls on Monday June 30th for a follow up investigation of the wildlife to be found in the newly developed 'meadow' areas in the churchyard.

The group found that a range of grasses were dominating, as the soil is so rich. Some flowers were discovered, speedwells, ragwort and clovers, to mention just a few. The areas have been closely mown since, and all clippings removed to help reduce fertility so that wild flowers can thrive.

A grant from the Stepping Stones Project will enable the group to plant a variety of wild flowers in the autumn.

Around the churchyard a number of invertebrates were found in the trees, including birch shield bugs, red legged shield bugs, marmalade hover fly, mayfly and cranefly. A moth larva wrapped in a leaf was seen, as well as three types of ladybird or their larvae, harlequin, 2 spot and 10 spot.

YOUNG PEOPLE in RATBY

You may recall an article in 'Wot' some issues ago about an enterprising local young man, Jamie Trusler.

We asked him for an update on his activities, and he has been in touch!

"Recently I have been elected into Youth Parliament as a Deputy Member (As well as now being part of the British Youth Council) I have also been selected to be a part of a Youth Commissioning Team, which is currently commissioning the largest amount of money of any Youth Commission in the world. Unfortunately I'm unable to tell you how much this is! I have been nominated for Young Volunteer of the year for the Lord-Lieutenant's Young People's Awards by Jennifer, Lady Gretton, JP. Here in the village I have attended a Ratby Parish Council meeting, and I am now working alongside them to start a new youth group in Ratby, which will follow a structured program, such as the Duke of Edinburgh Award. We are also looking into starting a Ratby Parish Youth Council, similar to the Leicestershire Youth Council of which I am a part. Once set up this means that the young people of Ratby will get a say on what happens around Ratby, although all thoughts and decisions will be made final by Ratby Parish Council. Of course we are still in the early foundations of this, and are working to get these started! Separate to this I am hoping to start some local Social Action Projects which help individuals to make their mark in local communities. They can range from: clearing pounds or rivers out, raising money and awareness of National, Regional, and Local charities, painting in local community buildings and schools, that kind of thing. So if you have any ideas, please get in touch with the editor of the WOT and they can give you my email. Also following my most recent letter from Sir Jeremy Heywood, Cabinet Secretary, I have decided to write a letter to RT Hon David Cameron MP. In this letter I would like to address the issues that are affecting young people today, and also express the importance of teaching Basic First Aid in schools,

as part of St John Ambulance's current campaign, 'The Difference'. "
