RATBY CUBS GO DIPPY FOR THEIR CONSERVATION BADGES



their discoveries with those of the Community Orchard Pond dipping events which are held annually in August. There were many more tadpoles, some already developing legs for their transition to frogs, and two fresh water mussels were found.

A number of newts were discovered; something we don't usually see in August. But the highlight of the evening was a smooth newt! Pictured are the cubs getting stuck in and attempting to identify their finds.

So Quilteez was born. The small shop in Ratby was available at just the right time in a perfect location with nearby parking not too far from her home. Jeannie says she's received a warm welcome to the village, with people popping in to see what's happening and a lot of interest.

A recent quilting exhibition in Market Bosworth which Jeannie was involved in raised £2000 for charity.

Jeannie began quilting around fifteen years ago, having been introduced to it by her sister Linda. And she and this same sister are now running courses in Ratby using several village halls at different times. Heather Jacks who won the 2014 Great British Sewing Bee will be running a class on Tuesday 12th July from 10 until 4pm in the Chapel Rooms.

It's great to touch and see the fabrics, but you can also order on the internet by visiting the website.


Jeannie is also a Bernina agent, and if you are interested you can pop in for a demonstration using a specialist machine with stitch regulators as standard.



HM THE QUEEN'S 90TH BIRTHDAY EVENT

The Parish Council and other village groups held an event on 11th June 2016 in honour of HM The Queen's 90th Birthday. The Methodist Church hosted stall holders and provided tea and cakes, whilst the Village Hall had an Art Exhibition and provided afternoon teas. St Philip & St James Church held a coffee morning and cake stall and Ratby Co-operative Band provided musical entertainment in the afternoon. Ratby Library Group provided refreshments at its Cafe and hosted a display covering HM the Queen's reign, put on by Ratby Local History Group. The Sports Club provided refreshments and entertainment in the evening. The Derbyshire, Leicestershire & Rutland Air Ambulance was the chosen charity. A total of £423.40 was raised.

COMMEMORATIVE MEDALS

The Parish Council purchased Commemorative Medals which were given to the children at Ratby Primary School and Ratby Pre-School. Medals were also given to all those residents who were 90 years of age and to those who were attaining their 90th Birthday in 2016.

BIRD BOXES

The Council has also purchased Bird, Bat & Owl boxes, some of which have been assembled by Primary School children, with help from parents and staff. These boxes will be erected at suitable sites throughout the village.

At RATBY LIBRARY

Our Community run Library will be changing opening hours on weekdays from July 18th, but will still open for the usual number of hours. The nine o'clock start was introduced to allow parents to call in after dropping children off at school or Playgroup but has not proved popular. An increase in walkers and rambling groups at the end of the day has prompted the revised hours of 10 until 5 pm to cater for their needs.

Children's Reading

At the end of August the County Council computers will be replaced with new Laptops for community use. A new, faster Broadband Internet Service will be in place.

Book Exchange


