FIRST RATBY SCOUTS START 2016 WITH A BANG!





Our Legal Status

On November 4th the group was awarded charitable status with the Charity Commission as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), number 1164252. Until we had this business status Leicestershire County Countil would not begin the process of creating the grant and lease documents. We have now signed the 3 legal documents and instructed a solicitor to act on our behalf.


Our Volunteers

It is essential that we take full advantage of the free training offered by the County Council or be forced to pay for training outside of the 'free' window.

Training runs from the 25th January until 5th February with Saturday 6th February for practical sessions prior to **our taking over on Monday 8th**. It is essential for all volunteers to have arranged their training schedule with Ken Hunnybun so we can fill the free places available. There are muliple choices for each scope of the training. Unfortunately there will be some, but minimal, disruption to opening times. Funding

We bid for a My Coop Community Grant and were awarded £2,500. The trustees are seen with the cheque outside our local COOP store.



We have also applied to Biffa for £45,000 but won't hear until early February. This sum will enable us to undertake a considerable amount of internal restructuring needed to allow us to deliver our business plan.

We are looking at other funders to find a home for the other money, taking us to our total of £115.000.

Crow Pie Cafeteria

Initially we shan't be using the CO-OP money to provide cafeteria seating but will wait until we have a major refurbishment, planned assuming we achieve success through Biffa. Until that time we shall utilise the furniture available, which should give us 17 seating places.

Our menu will cater for morning coffees, light lunches and afternoon teas. Pop along and get us off to a flying start; 2 volunteers will be running the cafeteria with another 2 looking after the library.

Extra Reading Support for Children

Attracting up to 22 children, Sixth Formers from Groby Community College together with other volunteers read to and with the children on Tuesday afternoons from 3:20pm.

A couple of mums have visited the library on other days to tell the library assistant that their children are showing improvements in their reading following the additional support we provide; this is most encouraging and we have passed this information on to the volunteers.

Michelle Tobin, Deputy Head Teacher at the Primary pops in to view progress and is encouraged with what she's seen.

Though the students are doing this as part of their own enrichment commitment to the community they know that they are helping to enrich the lives of our children too.

Web Site

Our web site is under development to ensure it is a good source of information about what events and activities we're hosting. We are also planning a comprehensive village diary with information about all other local voluntary organisations. We shall also promote local businesses, which subscribe to advertising on our site.

CRY Great Cake Bake 2015

On Saturday 28 October 2015 we held our annual cake and coffee morning at Ratby Sports Club. Thanks to the support of our friends and neighbours we raised £420.

As well as serving tea or coffee with a homemade scone or cake there was a raffle and a tombola. Everyone enjoyed the morning. It gave them a chance to catch up with others in the village that they may not have seen for some time, as well as raising money for a good cause.

The following week an envelope was dropped through our door containing a cheque for £500. This was sent from the Edith Murphy Foundation. One of the trustees attended our event with his wife and reported back to the others what a worthy charity CRY is and they decided to make a donation.

A further £80 was received from our daughter, Sara. She teaches at a school in Sutton Coldfield and this year instead of sending cards the staff decided to donate to a charity. CRY was drawn as the charity making the grand total £1,000 which is absolutely amazing!

CRY – Cardiac Risk in the Young is a charity that we have supported since losing our son Greg suddenly in October 2009. Each week in the UK at least 12 apparently fit and healthy young people die of undiagnosed heart conditions. CRY offer support to affected families as well as supporting research into this condition. They aim to make cardiac screening accessible to all young people aged between 14 and 35.

Thanks to everyone who helped us and Ratby Sports Club for allowing us to hold the event there.


















