
## WOT! About Ratby PUBLISHED BY RATBY SCOUT GROUP

#### WILD LIFE in RATBY CHURCHYARD

Following a fascinating talk by David Nicholls of 'Naturespot' about the wildlife that can be found around the village, a group of enthusiasts led by the Church Eco group joined him to explore the churchyard on Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> April.

We began by surveying the two areas that have been left unmown to create wildlife friendly patches. Already the pale mauve flowers of Lady's Smock could be seen standing proud to celebrate their reprieve from the mowers. Most of the Churchyard was explored, including walls and boundary trees. And we were helped by visiting specialists Steve Woodward, who has been surveying Leicestershire Churchyards for many years and Helen Ikin who has expertise in bee identification.

The weather was cool and wet, so we did not see many insects or Lepidoptera. A further survey is proposed for August, so we'll hope for some sunshine.



'I enjoy cubs because we play lots of games and it's the opposite of school....fun!!' Joe B


'I enjoy cubs because we do lots of fun activities and games. I also like how you can make new friends and learn new things.' Travis H

A minor change of name to 'His and Hers Regency Salon' might be appropriate?



**ASTILL and JORDAN** 

It has been almost two years since Mick Gamble, in conjunction with the Leicester Transport Heritage Trust, published his first substantial volume covering the history of local independent bus operator Browns Blue.

In his second publication Mick covers the history of one of Leicestershire's oldest private bus companies Astill and Jordan of Ratby. Astills ran regular, reliable bus services from Ratby to Leicester and the surrounding areas as well as providing school transport, contract work, private hire, tour and excursion work, for a total of more than 65 years. Astill and Jordan finally sold out to Wreake Valley Travel (Midland Fox) in November 1988. Over twenty five years have passed since that time and Mick feels that it is time to record those memories before they are lost forever.
